Many thanks to all those who joined us. On March 12, 2024, delegations from over 58 associations in 14 EU countries sent representatives to the European Parliament in Strasbourg.

Activists from co-signatory associations came from Alsace, of course, but also from Germany, Austria, Blaye, Bure, the Rhone Valley... Greenpeace Strasbourg was also there.

We'd like to thank them all for their support, and we were nearly 200 strong as the vote by MPs was imminent.

As a result, several MPs joined us to pledge their support and make statements: members of the Austrian Greens and EELV France, as well as candidates for the European elections in the Grand-Est region.

Among the speeches were

- the founder of "nos voisins lointains 3.11" Kurumi, who has done important work on the victims of the Fukushima disaster. Journalist Youki recalled the 2 atomic bombs dropped on Japan, then listed the multiple damage suffered and still suffered by these distant neighbors, whose populations continue to be stricken.
- A delegation of anti-nuclear students was also present, each making a clear and firm stand against the obsolete Euratom treaty, and reminding us of the dangers of nuclear policy...

- The Blaye activists pointed out that CN de Blaye has come very close to a nuclear accident on several occasions.

The Bure activists firmly stated that the Bure radioactive waste burial project is dangerous for the planet and the future of generations to come.

We are calling for the abrogation of the Euratom Treaty, signed in 1957, which laid the foundations for cooperation between the member states of

the European Economic Community (EEC) on civil and military nuclear energy. We would like to see a new treaty based on renewable energies.
